
1. CHANGING BLADES





Inserting the Blade Base

 Slide the back of the blade base into the recess in the housing.




2. Push the front of the blade base into the housing until it clicks into place.




Remove the Blade Base

1. Press and hold the base release button.



2. Remove the base by lifting from the front and then sliding out.



Note: Ensure the base is supported by hand when the release button is pressed to prevent it falling unexpectedly.



2. INSERTING & REMOVING THE BATTERY

Inserting a Battery

1. Align the ribs of the battery with the recess at the back of the handle.



2. Slide the battery in so that it clicks into place.



Removing a Battery


1. Press and hold the battery release tab and then slide out.



3. CONTROLS

Switching On and Off

 Press and hold the safety switch and then squeeze the on/off trigger to start.



 To stop operation, release the on/off trigger.




Top cutting

Use a wide sweeping motion. A slight downward tilt of the cutting blades in the direction of motion gives the best cutting results.



Side cutting

When trimming the sides of the hedge, begin at the bottom and cut upwards. Trim the side of a hedge so that it will be slightly narrower at the top. This shape will expose more of the hedge, resulting in a more uniform growth.



Using the Grass Shear:

Move the grass shear parallel to the ground. Direct the shear forward smoothly. Do not sweep the shear from side to side as this will not allow the blade to cut properly.

Sharpening the cutting blade


- Start and stop your trimmer until the cutter blade and the guard are slightly offset.
- 2. Remove the battery pack from your trimmer/shear.
- Clamp the blade assembly in a vise and file the exposed cutting surface of each blade tooth. Remove as little material as possible.
- Remove the blade from the vise and insert the battery pack. Repeat steps 1-3 for the unsharpened edges of the blade teeth.

Note: Do not operate your trimmer/shear with dull or damaged cutting blades. This may cause overload and will give unsatisfactory cutting results.



For best operation and longer blade life, lubricate the blade with light weight machine oil before and after each use.

- 1. Remove the battery pack from the trimmer/ shear.
- Lay the blade on a flat surface. Apply a light weight machine oil along the edge of the top blade.



WARNING: DO NOT OIL WHILE THE TRIMMER/ SHEAR IS RUNNING.

Cleaning and Storage

- Keep air intake clean and air vents free of debris to avoid overheating the motor.
- Do not use cleaning agents to clean the plastic parts of the tool.
 A mild detergent on a damp cloth is recommended. Water must never come into contact with the tool.
- If the trimmer vibrates abnormally, stop motor immediately. Abnormal vibration usually indicates a mechanical problem continued operation could lead to injury or damage.
- Always place the blade cover on the blade before storing or transporting the hedge trimmer. Use caution to avoid the sharp teeth of the blade.
- Store the hedge trimmer indoors, in a dry place that is inaccessible to children.





THIS MANUAL CONTAINS IMPORTANT SAFETY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR BATTERY CHARGER.

- Before using the charger read all instructions and cautionary markings on the charger, battery pack and the product using the battery pack.
- This charger is not intended for any uses other than charging rechargeable batteries. Any other use may result in risk of fire, electric shock or electrocution.
- Do not place any object on top of the charger or place the charger on a soft surface that may
 result in excessive internal heat. Place the charger in a position away from any heat source.
- To reduce risk of damage to the electric plug and cord, pull by the plug rather than the cord when disconnecting the charger.
- Make sure the cord is located so that it will not be stepped on, tripped over, or otherwise subjected to damage or stress.
- An extension cord should not be used unless absolutely necessary. Use of an improper extension cord could result in the risk of fire, electric shock or electrocution.
- Do not operate the charger if it has received a sharp blow, been dropped or otherwise damaged in any way. Have it checked by an electrician or power tool repairer.

- Never attempt to open the battery pack for any reason. If the plastic housing of the battery pack breaks or cracks, immediately discontinue use and do not recharge.

This tools charger is double insulated in accordance with AS/NZS 60335.1 therefore no earth wire is required.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid hazard.

Note: Double insulation does not take the place of normal safety precautions when operating this tool. The insulation system is for added protection against injury resulting from a possible electrical insulation failure within the tool.

Using an Extension Lead

Always use an approved extension lead suitable for the power input of this tool. Before use, inspect the extension lead for signs of damage, wear and ageing. Replace the extension lead if damaged or defective.

When using an extension lead on a reel, always unwind the lead completely. Use of an extension lead not suitable for the power input of the tool or which is damaged or defective may result in a risk of fire and electric shock.

To reduce the risk of electric shock, we recommend the use of a residual current device (rated 30mA or less).

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. 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
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
1. CHARGING A BATTERY



- 1 Connect the charger into a mains power outlet.
- 2 The charger LED will flash green showing power is being supplied to the charger.



3 With the battery sitting on a flat surface, align the raised ribs on the battery with the recess in the charger and slide onto the battery ensuring a firm connection.



4 The charger LED will illuminate red signifying that the battery is charging.

Note: The battery will not develop a memory, it does not have to be fully discharged before recharging

5 When removing the charger from the battery, first press the battery release tab, then slide the charger from its position.

GREEN (Flashing)	Stand By (no battery pack is inserted)

2. MAINTENANCE

- Disconnect the charger from power source before cleaning
- Keep the charger in a dry place out of reach of children.
- If the enclosure of the charger requires cleaning, do not use solvents. Use a dry, soft cloth only to wipe down the surface. Never let any liquid get inside the charger; never immerse any part of the drill into a charger.
- There are no other parts inside the charger which require maintenance.Do not take the charger apart. If the charger is damaged, contact your supplier or the manufacturer.
