

DAFFODIL BUTTERFLY MIXED



Daffodil Butterfly Mixed also known as Split Cup Daffodils have a split and reflexed cup or trumpet which folds or opens back across the petals. Excellent as a cut flower to bring Spring indoors, Daffodils look great when planted under trees. Better suited to the cooler climates; best treated as an annual in areas that do not get a cold Winter or have a short hot Spring.

DAFFODIL KING ALFRED



Daffodil King Alfred The traditional symbol of Spring, Daffodils are ideal for pots, tubs and the garden. Leave in the ground year after year and the bulbs will multiply and create large clumps of colour. Excellent as a cut flower to bring Spring indoors, Daffodils look great when planted under trees. Better suited to the cooler climates; best treated as an annual in areas that do not get a cold Winter or have a short hot Spring.

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DOUBLE FREESIA MIXED



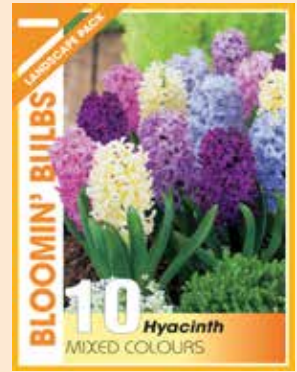
Double Freesias have an extra row of petals within each flower so they have a much fuller appearance than any other Freesias. All this without sacrificing the fragrance and colour! Double Freesias make beautifully scented cut flowers. Plant in large clumps to add masses of colour to your garden beds or pots. Select a well drained soil and plant and forget. Prefers a full sun to part shade position and are ideal for pots and containers. Mid season flowering.

FREESIA MIXED



Freesia Mixed are the traditional garden variety that is commonly known as 'Grandma's Freesia'. Soft and delicate creamy white blooms with a hint of pink and very highly perfumed. Freesias are very easy to grow and perfect for naturalising. Simply select a well drained soil and plant and forget. Prefers a full sun to part shade position and are ideal for pots and containers. Mid season flowering.

HYACINTH MIXED



Hyacinth Mixed is a beautiful assortment of colours. Enjoy these highly perfumed blooms in pots, containers or garden beds. Ideal for growing in pots. Can use these bulbs as borders where wafts of fragrance are sure to delight in early Spring. Hyacinths need a chilling period so in warmer climates ensure they are refrigerated for a 6 week period before plantings, and for long lasting blooms a full sun to partly shaded position will ensure the beauties will perform to their fullest.

MUSCARI



Muscari Blue (Grape Hyacinth) has vibrant blue flowers held above strappy green foliage. Muscari are a carefree plant and forget style bulb. Ideal for potted colour, creating borders or naturalising under trees, they multiply well and are prolific flowering. Hardy, drought tolerant and easy to grow. Early spring flowering.

RANUNCULI MIXED



Ranunculi Mixed are a brightly coloured long flowering favourite. A tough and prolific bloomer, Ranunculus prefers a full sun position in well drained soil. They look amazing when planted en masse in garden beds. In dry climates soak bulbs in a bowl of water for an hour before planting and plant with the legs facing down. Liquid fertilise regularly for a longer lasting show and repeat flowering.

LATE TULIPS



Late Tulips have tall strong stems with well shaped blooms that retain their shape and colour to the end. They are the best variety for naturalising and are perfect for warmer regions, but will also extend the display well through the Spring Months. Late Tulips are the best choice for warmer climates, cool them in your fridge for 6 weeks then plant them deeper than recommended, and lift them once they die off.
