## **CULTURAL CARE**

Grows well in most soil types given good drainage. Low watering requirements withstanding some dryness but should be watered regularly during extended periods of heat. Pruning generally not required. An application of a native formulated slow release fertiliser in late summer would be beneficial to overall performance.

A small native shrub originating from south eastern regions of Australia, this variety has been specially selected for its compact habit, larger flowers and prolific blooming abilities. It brings welcome colour to the late winter garden and is fabulous for containers at this time which can be brought closer to living areas for viewing when the cold may keep you inside! To carry on a native theme you could partner with such plants as Lomandra 'Little Con', Brunoniella 'Little Blue Trumpets' and Correa 'Ring A Ding Ding'. In a general mixed border it looks stunning against silver foliage such as can be provided by Convolvulus 'Silver Moon' and Teucrium 'Silver Box'.
