

Phlox hybrid 'Minnie Pink'

FEATURES:

- Earlier flowering and short in habit.
- Long flowering perennial topped with masses of clustered, musk pink flowers from early spring to autumn.
- Mildew resistant with a slow spreading habit.
- Attracts butterflies and other pollinators.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Rockeries or containers.
- Small gardens or spaces.
- Fast results for new gardens.
- Mixed borders and general garden use.

CULTURAL CARE:

Prefers an open, well draining soil in a full sun location although afternoon shade will be tolerated. Medium watering requirements withstanding some dryness but should be watered regularly during extended periods of heat. Apply a slow release fertiliser in early spring. Cut back by half and apply slow release fertiliser after main flowering to encourage further flushes. Frost hardy.

Perennial Phlox originates from eastern regions of the United States of America and is grown worldwide for its reliable garden performance and generous flowering displays. The genus name *Phlox* comes from the Greek literally meaning 'flame' - referring to the glowing display of colour. Flower stems last well in floral arrangements and offer a sweet fragrance. Ideal for creating mixed borders of frothy colour when blended with other cottage perennials such as Penstemon 'Purpleicious', Scabiosa 'Samanthas Pink', Cosmos 'Chocoholic', Agastache FIESTA range as well as other members of the Phlox family such as P. 'Minnie Pearl'.
