



1. FITTING THE BATTERY


Installing the Battery Pack

1. Slide the battery into the drill base until it clicks into place.



Removing the Battery Pack

 Hold down the battery release button and then slide the battery out.







Installing a Drill Bit


 Rotate the chuck collar anticlockwise to open the chuck




Insert the drill bit, making sure it is centred in the chuck.



3. Tighten the chuck by turning clockwise.




4 Pull on the bit to ensure it is firmly secured.



Removing a Drill Bit

 Open the chuck by rotating the chuck collar and remove the drill bit.



3. CONTROLS


Forward / Reverse Lever

 For forward rotation, push the fwd/rev lever towards the left side of the drill. For reverse rotation push fwd/rev lever to the right.




Variable Speed Trigger

1. To start drilling squeeze the variable speed trigger.



To stop drilling release the trigger.




Note: The more the variable speed trigger is depressed, the faster the drill bit will rotate.

Adjusting Torque

1. Rotate the torque collar to the desired setting.


Note: Selecting a higher torque setting will allow the drill to use more torque to drive the screw in or out. To prevent damaging the screw head, it is recommended to start at a low torque setting and increase when necessary.



Speed Control

The gear selector controls the speed of the drill. First gear allows slower drilling with more torque, while second gear is suitable when less torque but higher speed is required.


- 1. Slide the switch forward to select first gear.
- 2. Slide the switch backward to select second gear.


Drilling

 To drill into wood, metal or plastic, turn the function collar to the align the arrow on the housing with the drill icon.




Hammer Drilling


 To drill into concrete, brick or other masonry, turn the function collar to the align the arrow on the housing with the hammer icon.




Screw Driving to a Preset Depth

- Turn the function collar to the align the arrow on the housing with the screw icon.
- Set the torque collar to lowest setting and tighten the first screw.






 If the clutch ratchets and makes a clicking sound before screw is flush, increase the collar setting and continue tightening.




 Repeat until you reach the correct setting/ screw depth. Use this setting for the remaining screws.




5. DRILLING


Before starting to drill, perform a few simple checks.

- 1. Depress and release the variable speed trigger to ensure it is not locked on.
- 2. Check the forward/reverse lever is on desired setting.






Secure the material to be drilled in a vice or clamp to stop it turning whilst drilling.




- 4. Hold the drill firmly and place the bit at the point to be drilled.
- 5. Depress the variable speed trigger to start the drill.





6. Move the drill bit into the workpiece.



Note: Do not force the drill or apply side pressure to elongate the hole. Let the drill do all the work.

MAINTENANCE

TROUBLESHOOTING

LED lights do not illuminate on charger

Check the charging adaptor is securely plugged into the wall outlet. Check the battery is firmly connected to the charging cradle.

Check that the charging jack is securely connected to the charging cradle.

The battery has a short run time

Ensure the battery is properly charged. It will take 4-5 charging cycles before the battery reaches optimum charge and run time.

Variable speed trigger is locked

Ensure that the forward / reverse lever is in the correct position; pressed left for forwards direction, pressed right for backwards direction. If it is in between the two settings the variable speed trigger will be locked.

The drill is stripping the screw head

Ensure you are starting with a low torque setting and holding the drill securely onto the screw head. Increase the torque setting as required.

Drill has cut out during use

The drill may have cut out due to excessive hand pressure. Reduce the hand pressure applied while drilling.

The battery charge could be completely depleted. Place the battery on the charging cradle and charge the battery.

Sparking visible through the housing air vents

A small amount of sparking may be visible through the housing vents.

This is normal and does not indicate a problem.

With the battery sitting on a flat surface, align the raised ribs on the battery with the recess in the charging cradle and slide onto the battery ensuring a firm connection.



3 The red LED on the charging cradle will illuminate signifying that the battery is charging.



Note: The battery will not develop a memory, it does not have to be fully discharged before recharging.

4 Once the green LED on the charging cradle illuminates, the battery is charged and can be removed from the charging cradle using the battery release button.



- Do not operate the charger if it has received a sharp blow, been dropped or otherwise damaged in any way. Have it checked by an electrician or power tool repairer
- Do not disassemble charger. Take it to an electrician or power tool repairer when 8. service or repair is required. Incorrect reassembly may result in a risk of electric shock, electrocution or fire.
- To reduce risk of electric shock, unplug the charger from the outlet before attempting any cleaning. Removing the battery pack will not reduce this risk.
- Never attempt to connect 2 chargers together.
- DO NOT store or use the tool and battery pack in locations where the temperature may reach 11. or exceed 40°C (such as inside sheds or metal buildings in summer).
- The charger is designed to operate on standard household electrical power (240 volts). Do not attempt to use it on any other voltage!

This tools charger is double insulated therefore no earth wire is required.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by an electrician or a power tool repairer in order to avoid a hazard.

Note: Double insulation does not take the place of normal safety precautions when operating this tool. The insulation system is for added protection against injury resulting from a possible electrical insulation failure within the tool.

Using an Extension Lead

Always use an approved extension lead suitable for the power input of this tool. Before use. inspect the extension lead for signs of damage, wear and ageing. Replace the extension lead if damaged or defective.

When using an extension lead on a reel, always unwind the lead completely. Use of an extension lead not suitable for the power input of the tool or which is damaged or defective may result in a risk of fire and electric shock.

CHARGING YOUR LITHIUM ION BATTERY

This battery has been shipped in a low charge condition, and requires charging prior to use. Allow several cycles of charging and discharging (through use with a compatible tool) for the battery to reach its optimum performance / runtime.

This battery has two compatible Ozito chargers available through your local Bunnings Warehouse:

- · ZLCG-112 Fast Charger
- ZLCG-312 Eco Charger
- Insert the power plug of the charger into the mains socket outlet.
 The red LED on the plug will begin to illuminate when properly connected to power supply.
- 2. Insert the battery pack into the battery charger .
- 3. Remove battery from the charger once fully charged. Disconnect the charger from the power supply.

Note: The battery pack can become a little warm during the charging. This is normal

If the battery pack fails to charge, check:

- · if there is voltage at the socket outlet
- · that the battery and charger are properly connected.

If the battery pack still fails to charge, please contact our customer service center.

BATTERY PROTECTION SYSTEM

The tool is equipped with a battery protection system, which helps to ensure longevity of the battery.

The output power automatically cuts off during operation when the tool and/or battery are placed under the following situations:

· When the tool is overloaded:

If this occurs, release the trigger switch and remove causes of overload, then pull the switch trigger again to restart.

When the remaining battery capacity becomes low:

Recharge the battery pack.
