ELECTRICAL SAFETY

WARNING! When using mains-powered tools, basic safety precautions, including the following, should always be followed to reduce risk of fire, electric shock, personal injury and material damage.

Read the whole manual carefully and make sure you know how to switch the tool off in an emergency, before operating the tool. Save these instructions and other documents supplied with this tool for future reference.

Note: The supply of 230V and 240V on Ozito tools are interchangeable for Australia and New Zealand.



This tools charger is double insulated, therefore no earth wire is required.

 If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid hazard.

Note: Double insulation does not take the place of normal safety precautions when operating this tool. The insulation system is for added protection against injury resulting from a possible electrical insulation failure within the tool.

2. Using an Extension Lead

Always use an approved extension lead suitable for the power input of this tool. Before use, inspect the extension lead for signs of damage, wear and ageing. Replace the extension lead if damaged or defective.

When using an extension lead on a reel, always unwind the lead completely. Use of an extension lead not suitable for the power input of the tool or which is damaged or defective may result in a risk of fire and electric shock.

- 3. To reduce the risk of electric shock, we recommend the use of a residual current device (rated 30mA or less).
- 4. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including

- children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- 5. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

BATTERY PACK SAFETY WARNINGS

THIS MANUAL CONTAINS IMPORTANT SAFETY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR BATTERY.

- Before using the charger read all instructions and cautionary markings on the charger, battery pack and the product using the battery pack.
- This charger is not intended for any uses other than charging rechargeable batteries. Any other use may result in risk of fire, electric shock or electrocution.
- Only use the compatible XU1 charger to recharge this XU1 battery.
- Do not place any object on top of the charger or place the charger on a soft surface that may result in excessive internal heat. Place the charger in a position away from any heat source.
- To reduce risk of damage to the electric plug and cord, pull by the plug rather than the cord when disconnecting the charger.
- Make sure the cord is located so that it will not be stepped on, tripped over, or otherwise subjected to damage or stress.
- An extension cord should not be used unless absolutely necessary. Use of an improper extension cord could result in the risk of fire, electric shock or electrocution.
- Do not operate the charger if it has received a sharp blow, been dropped or otherwise damaged in any way. Have it checked by an electrician or power tool repairer.
- Do not disassemble charger. Take it to an electrician or power tool repairer when service or repair is required. Incorrect reassembly may result in a risk of electric shock, electrocution or fire.
- To reduce risk of electric shock, unplug the charger from the outlet before attempting any cleaning. Removing the battery pack will not reduce this risk.
- Never attempt to connect 2 chargers together.
- DO NOT store or use the tool and battery pack in locations where the temperature may reach or exceed 40°C (such as inside sheds or metal buildings in summer).
- The charger is designed to operate on standard household electrical power (240 volts). Do not attempt to use it on any other voltage!
- The battery pack is not fully charged out of the carton. First read the safety instructions and then follow the charging notes and procedures.
- 15. The longest life and best performance can be obtained if the battery pack is charged when the air temperature is between 18 - 24°C. Do not charge the battery pack in an air temperature below 10°C or above 40°C. This is important and will prevent damage to the battery pack.
- Do not incinerate the battery pack even if it is seriously damaged or is completely worn out. The battery can explode in a fire.
- Never attempt to open the battery pack for any reason. If the plastic housing of the battery pack breaks or cracks, immediately discontinue use and do not recharge.
- During charging, the battery must be placed in a well ventilated area.

1. Insert the power plug of the charger into the mains socket

2. To charge the battery, slide the battery pack onto the port

in the charger. Make sure the release latch on the rear

of the battery snaps into place and the battery is secure

3. Remove the battery from the charger once fully charged

by pressing the battery release latch and pulling the

battery pack from the charger at the same time.

4. Disconnect the charger from the power supply.

Charging Your Battery

WARNING! Ensure the tool is turned off and disconnected from the power supply before performing any of the following operations.

CONTROLS

Battery Capacity Indicator

There are battery capacity indicators on the battery pack. Check the charge capacity of your battery before use and charge if necessary.

- To check the battery capacity, press the button to the side of the indicator LEDs.
- 2. Indicator Status:
 - 3 lit LEDs: Battery fully charged.
 - 2 lit LEDs: Battery 60% charged.
 - 1 lit LED: Battery almost discharged.

OPERATION

Fitting the Battery Pack

- 1. Slide the battery into the base of the tool until it clicks into place.
- 2. To remove the battery, press and hold the battery release tab down then remove the battery.
